"New Build" Approval For SBGHC - Kincardine Site

The recent announcement of the approval of a redevelopment project for South Bruce Grey Health Centre's (SBGHC) Kincardine site by the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care is wonderful news for our community. This means that excellent health care delivery will continue to be provided and enhanced at the Kincardine site for many years ahead. This decision will benefit citizens in the primary catchment areas of the municipalities of Kincardine and Huron-Kinloss, as well as to a lesser degree, the municipalities of Brockton, West Grey, Arran-Elderslie, South Bruce, Hanover, Chatsworth, Southgate and Saugeen Shores.

The "new build" approval will also greatly benefit our stability and growing economy, by "playing a key role in the recruitment and retention of much needed primary health practitioners" as well as attracting new business, talented employees, tourists, new housing construction and preserving the quality of life that we enjoy and value.

Once the new design has been finalized, a "new build" fundraising campaign, spearheaded by the Kincardine Foundation Hospital, will be launched under the banner "BUILDING FOR A HEALTHY FUTURE!"

We invite you to be a part of this exciting health care milestone for our community as we move forward to bring this plan for our future well-being to reality.

Foundation Excited about our Health Care Future!

Over the past years, I participated in several "Economic Development" feasibility studies. Each one always concluded that our most valuable asset to attract people to this area was our "quality of life." A major component of that "quality of life" is the provision of expert health care services provided by our health care professionals at both the Kincardine Hospital site and the Medical Center.

Currently, our Hospital facilities are vastly overcrowded, particularly the Emergency Room area. Consequently, a major study conducted under the capable oversight of Paul Davies, CEO of the South Grey Bruce Health Centers (SBGHC) along with the Board and Kincardine Hospital site staff, concluded that Kincardine was eligible to receive a "new build" hospital facility.

Fortunately, we are now at that juncture where our provincial Health Ministry has approved a "new build" redevelopment plan for our hospital and the Board has authorized the initiation of the design. The assessment of the new facilities by the Director of Patient Care, Kate Kincaid, provides an excellent insight into the benefits of the "new build" to the provision of health care at the Kincardine site. To provide ongoing coordination between the Kincardine Hospital Foundation Board and the SBGHC Board, we welcome Mr. Allen Wickert, a Director of the Board, to sit on the Foundation Board.

One of the key physical advantages of the "new build" hospital is the direct connection to the Medical Center, so that, as Kate points out, we truly have "One Stop Shopping."

In support of this "new build", there will be a significant fundraising campaign. The Kincardine Hospital Foundation will be overseeing the campaign and will be responsible to provide the community within the Kincardine site catchment area an ongoing progress report of the funds raised.

We urge everyone to embrace this "New Build" Kincardine Hospital Fundraising Campaign with enthusiasm, innovation and dedication. We never know when one of us, our family or friends will require the excellent health care services provided by our professional staff at the Kincardine site, now or in the coming years. Your help towards building for the future will insure our health care future.



Patient Care

It includes physically linking the new hospital design and the Kincardine Community Medical Centre.

Several key principles have been identified and helped to guide the development of the Master Plan:

- Leverage current and future technologies

These proposed programs and updated facilities are essential in supporting our new Community Family Health Team in the delivery of primary care services. 2011 Radiothon Another Community Triumph

The 10th Annual CKNX Health Care Heroes Radiothon took place Saturday, October 15, 2011 at the CKNX Wingham Studios with 16 Hospital Foundations participating. At the end of the day, \$666,443.00 was raised, bringing the 10-year total to slightly under \$7 million.

For the first time in my 8 years as Radiothon Chairman for our hospital, Kincardine topped the list with \$84,602.00. There is still money committed and coming in towards the purchase of the three automated medication-dispensing carts, which cost approximately \$50,000 each.

The total funds raised include proceeds from fundraisers held over the summer, grants and many donations from our generous and supportive community. The donation that put us over the top on Radiothon day was a \$10,000.00 presentation by Bart Cameron, the new CEO of Bruce Telecom; this was part of Bruce Telecom's 5-year commitment.

Services Available at SBGHC - Kincardine Site

Here is a brief summary of all the services available to our community at our local hospital. Thank you to the people in our community for your support in helping to keep our hospital current, with up-to-date equipment, and the ability to provide you with the best professional and compassionate care.

Services:

- 25 bed acute care hospital with Emergency Department which is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week with with trained nurses and medical staff always available.
- There is an active ambulatory care unit including pre- and post-operative clinics and surgical consultation.
- The Day Surgery Department is active 3 to 4 days a week. Dental surgery is also available on an out patient.
- Diagnostic Imaging (better known as X-Ray) offers not only X-Rays but also bone densitometry, mammography and ultrasound.
- The laboratory provides testing for both in and out patients. *Both the above departments have on call services available in emergency situations.*

- The Pharmacy Department serves as the main pharmacy for all 4 sites of the South Bruce Grey Health Centre.
- Several outpatient clinics are held at the hospital with many visiting specialists from different fields of medicine providing diagnosis, treatment and follow-up care to patients, thereby avoiding trips to the city.
- This includes the following specialties: cardiology, thoracic/respiratory, internal medicine, urology, gynecology and gastrointestinal medicine.
- Other services available at our local hospital include:
- Diabetic education and counseling by trained nurses and dieticians;
- Pastoral care;
- Palliative care and support, which is also available for patients, family and staff; *and*
- Therapeutic pet visiting, a positive experience for many patients and staff.
